McVale MIDWEST VALLEDMOUNT HOCKEY TOURNAMENT A SUCCESS

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PUBLIC WORKS SUPERVISOR/FOREMAN

Reporting to the Administrator, this is a working supervisor position responsible for directing public works staff and contractors in the water distribution, and sanitary sewer collection systems, road and drainage maintenance, parks and facilities maintenance and capital projects. Incumbent will be required to perform the duties involved in the various positions, including assisting with physical effort as required.

Summary of Duties & Responsibilities: (Full job specs available at Village office)

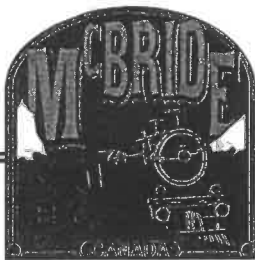
- Supervises and assists with preventive maintenance and repairs to water and sewer systems; installs and calibrates equipment including cleaning and inspection of lift station, pumps, reservoirs and lines. Ensures test procedures are done on a regular basis; assists in interpreting readings and results to make corrective adjustments.
- Supervises and assists with repair and maintenance of streets, sidewalks, land drainage, etc., including snow removal, street signs, road markings, traffic control devices, etc.
- Supervises and assists in the maintenance of parks grounds and equipment, cemetery, municipal buildings, grounds, equipment, and various related infrastructure.
- Assists with equipment maintenance, prepares maintenance and replacement schedules.
- Supervision of Works Dept. personnel and contractors; prepares work plans and schedules, participates in staff hiring, training, and evaluation. Ensures compliance with safety regulations and Village policies.
- Prepares and maintains records, schedules and reports; assists with policy & procedure development, long and short range planning and budgeting. Ensures compliance with requirements of all regulatory bodies.

Qualifications Required

- Six years of progressively responsible work experience in the utilities or general maintenance and trade area, with a minimum of three years of supervisory experience. This supervisory experience should be current (within the last five years) and be experienced in supervising similar crews and activities as found in public works operations.
- Possession of or ability to obtain a valid BC class 111 drivers license with an air endorsement.
- Possession of or ability to obtain appropriate certifications in Water Distribution - Level 1, Cross Connection Control Specialist, Treatment Plant Operator, CPR and First Aid Certificates.

This position requires the incumbent to attend meetings and respond to emergencies outside of normal hours as required. The successful candidate must be a team player, will possess excellent communication, interpersonal, public relations and time management skills, and possess strong oral and written communication skills. Incumbent will exercise a high degree of independent judgment in the provision of services within approved policies.
