- You are 18 years of age.
- You are a Canadian citizen.
- You have been a resident of BC for at least 6 months immediately preceding the day of registration,
- You have been a resident of the Village of McBride for at least 30 days immediately preceding the day of registration, and
- You are not otherwise disqualified by law from voting.

To register as a non-resident property elector, you must have obtained a Non-Resident Property Elector Certificate from the Village Clerk/ Administrator. Only those individuals who own property may register as non-resident property electors - corporations do not have the right

### VOTER IDENTIFICATION

RESIDENT AND NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY ELECTORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO PRODUCE TWO PIECES OF IDENTIFICATION (AT LEAST ONE WITH A SIGNATURE) TO PROVE IDENTITY AND/OR RESIDENCY IN ORDER TO VOTE. PICTURE IDENTIFICATION IS NOT NECESSARY. SOME EXAMPLES OF ACCEPTABLE IDENTIFICATION ARE: DRIVERS LICENCE, BCID CARD, ICBC INSURANCE CERTIFICATE, SOCIAL INSURANCE CARD, CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD, PROPERTY TAX NOTICE OR UTILITY BILL.


### Advance Voting Opportunities
