has brought eight Canadians to McBride. This makes McBride home to one of the largest Canadian Horse Breeders in Western Canada. "We wanted to move our breeding program to McBride, the opportunities available in this local are just too good to pass up" says Adam, "and in the near future we will have an equine semen collection and cryogenic facility up and running. I believe it is the only facility north of Kamloops". The history of the Canadian horse is very compelling. The first horse to gallop on Canadian soil was unloaded at Quebec on June 25th, 1647. It was sent as a gift to the governor, as it was thought unfitting that a knight should be without a horse. Eighteen years later on July 16th, 1665, ten mares and two stallions arrived. In 1667, another two mares and a stallion arrived. In 1670, a final shipment of eleven mares and one stallion were unloaded at Quebec. King Louis of France sent these horses to his colony. He sent the best of his personal stables, however we do not know the breeds. From there, the Canadian horse was born. There were no more horses sent to the colonies for several hundred years. Since there was no outside blood, the horse evolved into its own distinct breed. The Canadian Horse is a rare breed, only about 4000 in the world, well known for its hardiness and its role in the development of many other breeds. "We fell in love with these intelligent, gentle, people oriented horses and can't wait to introduce them to everyone." says Joy. Dreams Reach Farms' band of horses includes 2 year old Supreme Canadian Champion Stallion Woodmont Furie Lawrence. 
