POLICE REPORT

On September 19, 2004 a McBride resident turned in three mountain bikes he located in the Village of McBride. The owners of these mountain bikes can claim them by identifying them at the McBride Detachment.

During the early morning hours of the 24th of September the Scotiabank and the Sledman's Store on Main Street were vandalized by unknown suspects. Culprits wrote obscenities on the windows of both businesses. Anyone with any information relating to this mischief are requested to contact the McBride Detachment or Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-TIPS(8477).

On September 24th 2004, at approximately 2:30 p.m. McBride Detachment responded to a motor vehicle accident at the intersection of Main Street and 3rd Avenue. Investigation revealed that a McBride motorist failed to yield to a pedestrian crossing in the crosswalk. The incident occurred when the motorist turned from southbound Main Street to eastbound 3rd Avenue. The offending motorist was charged under the Motor Vehicle Act. Residents of McBride are reminded to pay extra attention to crosswalks especially given that school is in full swing.

On September 24th 2004, at 7:30 p.m. McBride Detachment responded to a motor vehicle accident approximately 35 kilometres west of McBride. Investigation revealed that a four door car was travelling westbound on Highway 16, the four door, crossed into the eastbound lane and collided with a truck and camper unit. The four door car caught the rear portion of the truck and camper unit. The four door car ended up in the south ditch of the highway. Police, Ambulance and the Fire Department all attended. The four door car was occupied by a male driver who was trapped in the vehicle until the Fire Department was able to pry open the door with their hydraulic equipment. The driver was taken to the McBride Hospital by Ambulance where he received treatment for minor non life threatening injuries. Alcohol appears to be a factor in the accident and police are still investigating.

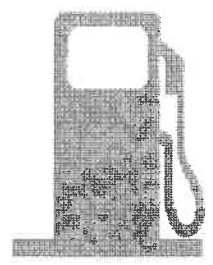
