**POLICE REPORT**

On June 29th, 2005, at approximately 6:45 AM McBride Detachment received an anonymous tip regarding a stolen 2004 F350 Ford crew cab pickup truck in the McBride area. The pickup was stolen out of Rocky Mountain House, Alberta. Two McBride Detachment members responded to the complaint and were briefing on Main Street when the members noted a pickup matching the description of the stolen vehicle departing the parking lot of the Husky service station. The pickup was carrying a flat deck with two four wheeler ATVs with an approximate replacement value of \$80,000. The stolen pickup headed westbound on Hwy. 16 then turned north, then turned east onto the Frontage Road in front of the North Country Lodge. One police vehicle followed the pickup down the Frontage Service Road while the second unit doubled back and blocked off access to the highway. The stolen pickup then proceeded north down Bridge Road into the Beaver Creek Cabins. The stolen pickup drove into a field where the lone male abandoned the vehicle and fled on foot. McBride Detachment requested the assistance of the Police Dog Service from Prince George along with a unit from North District Traffic Services. The suspect was located walking west on Museum Road then took off into the bush north of Museum Road. The police Dog tracked the suspect to the point where the suspect crossed the Dore River again travelling west. Members then received another tip the suspect was hitchhiking west bound on Hwy. 16 near Lammings Mills. The Police Dog and members attended the location and the suspect again took off into the bushes on the south side of the highway. An extensive search of the area did not uncover the suspect. The stolen vehicle will be examined by members of the Prince George Forensic Identification Section in hopes of recovering physical evidence. The suspect is described as an aboriginal male, 5'8" to 6' tall, short black hair, dark wet clothing, approximate age of between 18 to 22.

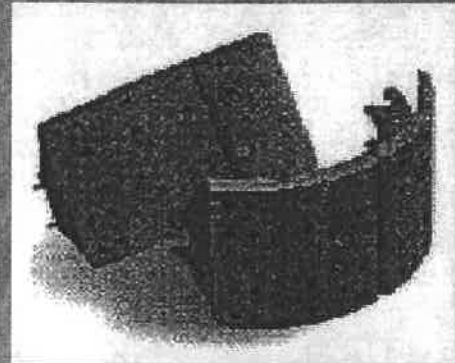

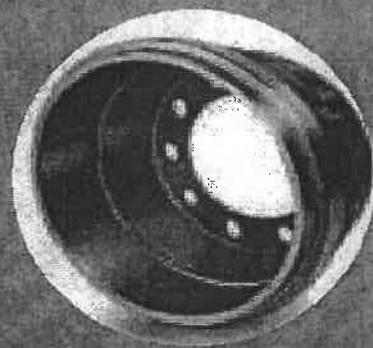

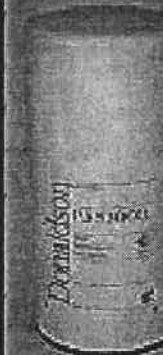
