POLICE REPORT

April 28, 2006 - A report was received of ROAD RAGE. A vehicle was attempting to pass a semi trailer unit on Hwy. 16, East of McBride near Jeck Road. The semi started to speed up and pace the driver in the opposite lane. Both vehicles went to the same service station and a verbal argument ensued. The driver of the semi unit was warned for increasing speed while another vehicle was passing.

April 29, 2006 - A vehicle was observed travelling at a high rate of speed on Dominion Crescent. An on duty officer was advised and the pickup was located. The driver displayed minor signs of alcohol impairment and admitted to consuming alcohol. The driver failed the alcohol screening device and was issued a 24 hour roadside suspension.

April 30, 2006 - A motor vehicle accident was reported on Highway 15, West at Dome Creek. The driver of a white Dodge van lost control of the vehicle on a slushy road and went off the road. The driver from Calgary sustained a broken finger and whiplash. The damage to the vehicle is estimated at \$15000.00.

April 30, 2006 - A report of a possible impaired driver on Mountainview Road was received. A pickup with camper was observed stuck in the ditch with the front end still on the roadway causing a traffic hazard. A lone male was found in the drivers seat, however there were no keys in the ignition. 3 grams of marijuana was seized from the floor of the pickup. There were no witnesses to this incident and a 24 hr. suspension notice was served and the driver was lodged in cells until sober.

May 03, 2006 - While on routine patrol on highway 16 East near Dunster, a vehicle was pulled over for speeding. The driver from Fox Creek, Alberta was issued a 24 hour suspension for signs of impairment caused by a drug. Cocaine paraphernalia was seized and the male admitted to smoking marijuana 3 hours previous. The male also had a warrant for Cocaine trafficking from Smithers, BC and was subsequently arrested and processed accordingly.

May 04, 2006 - A vehicle was observed driving erratically on main street around 9p.m. The vehicle was pulled over and the member observed that the driver was impaired. The driver was arrested and read the Breath demand. A report to Crown Counsel will be submitted with charges of Impaired Driving and over .08 being recommended.

May 05, 2006 - In the early morning hours a commercial alarm was reported on 3rd Ave. Attendance revealed an outside door was insecure and another door was left ajar. The building was secured and the perimeter was checked. Nothing further was noted.

May 05, 2006 - Another alarm was reported, this time around 8 am at a commercial address on 1st Ave. The incident was attended by a property representative and all was secure.
