Following are some points to remember during the snow season:

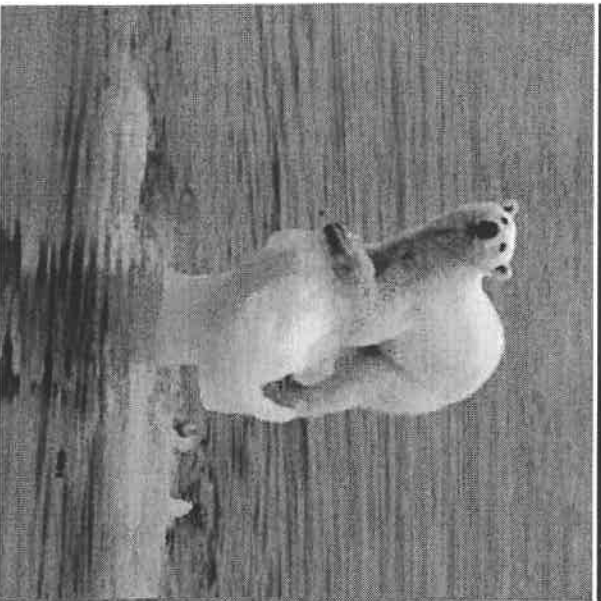
- Drive carefully and yield to snow removal equipment.

NH Marks National HIV Awareness Week

with call for testing.

Health professionals are urging testing for HIV (the virus that leads to AIDS) as Northern Health marks National HIV Awareness Week, especially given rising rates of the disease across Northern British Columbia.

26 new cases of HIV were reported across the North in 2006, with roughly two dozen new cases reported every year since HIV became a reportable disease in 2003. Over 4,000 people across Canada are infected with HIV every year (a new infection every two hours). Across Canada, it's estimated that over a quarter of the people infected with HIV don't know they're carrying the virus.

"A major concern is that there could be many people in the region who are infected but don't know it. While we have boosted resources in communities to better deal with the spread of blood-borne infections, we need area residents to take personal precautions. We're strongly encouraging people to have a HIV test as part of their regular health check-ups, and particularly if they're at risk" say Dr. David Bowering, NH chief medical health officer.

Health professionals are calling on area residences to ask themselves the following five questions, and have an HIV test if they answer yes to any of the questions:

1. Have you ever had sex without a condom (oral/vaginal/anal) with someone whose HIV status you weren't certain of (even with a regular partner such as a boyfriend/girlfriend/spouse)?
2. Have you ever used drugs with needles and/or other equipment that was shared?
3. Have you ever had a body piercing or tattoo that was done with a needle that could have been used on someone else before it was used on you? Or have you had a tattoo or piercing by someone who was not a professional?
4. Have you ever had a blackout or "lost time" due to drugs or alcohol?
5. Have you had unprotected sex with someone who has any of the above risks?

"We know HIV is spread person to person through contact with male or female sexual fluids, blood and breast milk. If people know that they have HIV and AIDS, they and their health care providers can manage it better. If it isn't managed well, HIV and AIDS can weaken a person's immune system...leading to life threatening infections," said Terrielle Selver, NH public health nurse.

HIV tests are available through family physicians, local health units, needle exchanges and health centres. Testing is free and confidential.
