### McBRIDE GRIZZLIES NEWS

McBRIDE GRIZZLIES REACH FINAL IN MERRITT - The McBride Grizzlies Midget Hockey Team started their season off with a Halloween weekend tournament in Merritt, BC. Teams from Vernon (2), Surrey, Langley, Abbotsford and Merritt participated. In Game 1 on Halloween night, the Grizzlies played the Vernon #4 team and took a decisive 8-2 win. Dylan Vizza had a very productive night with 4 goals. Grizzlies defenceman Rylan Moore, Noah Janecke and Bobby Brawn all chipped in with a combined 4 points (1G 3A). Grizzzie goalie, Robert Knezacek had a strong game between the pipes stopping numerous second chances. Forward Jordan Gibson, who got a late start to the season due to an injury, was his usual pest in-front of the opposing teams net. In the first of two games on Saturday the Grizzlies met the host team Merritt Centennials. Center, Keith Shawara, led the way with 4 assists in the 8-4 win. Vizza (2), Moore, Bryden Bastran, Darian Griffin and Billie Littlechild also notched goals. Grizzlies goalie, Tristan Quam, was steady in goal particularly on one glove-hand save. In the second Saturday game, Quam made some timely saves and the Grizzlies came from behind to tie Langley 4-4 in the exciting, fast game. Center, Dawson Drader, tied the game up with 6:48 left in the third. Moore, Vizza and Shawara also scored. Forward, Julie Vizza and Bastran had two assists each. The two wins and one tie put the Grizzlies in the semi-final against Surrey on Sunday morning. In the first skating game, the Grizzlies took a 3-2 lead into the third period and went on to win 5-3. Defenceman, Austin Gibson had a strong game in his own end controlling the puck. Forward and second year player, Shea Braten, continued to improve her play and the coaches noted it will only be a matter of time before she notches her first goal in hockey. Dylan Vizza (2G), Bastran, Griffin and Shawara all scored with Julie Vizza notching 3 assists. Brawn, Griffin and Moore also tallied with one assist each. The Grizzlies met Vernon #2 in the final at 1 pm on Sunday. In a low scoring, fast paced, back and forth game both teams answered each other goals which resulted in the game being tied throughout. Dylan Vizza scored twice with Shawara adding a single. Forward, Brett Jones almost notched a fourth goal for the Grizzlies but ripped a wrist shot off the cross bar. At the end of regulation time the score was tied 3-3. Tournament rules dictated the game would be decided in a shoot-out. In a very exciting shoot-out Shawara and Dylan Vizza were able to score for the Grizzlies with the Vernon team also answering with two goals in the first three rounds. Grizzlies goalie, Robert Knezacek was able to shut the door until a unbelievable tenth round when Vernon scored their third goal of the shoot-out. The Grizzlies were unable to score on their final attempt giving the Vernon Team the win. Although the players were very disappointed, coaches Gerry Portier, Brian Shawara and Brady Knezacek were very pleased with the strong play and effort so early in the season.

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### Could you explain how that works?"

The original plan was to purchase a new facility through fundraising and grants. That would mean that there would be no increase for local tax payers in the purchase of the new building. Expenses to operate and maintain the new building are expected to remain at roughly the same levels that the library and museum already pay to maintain their current buildings.

Through conversations with our municipal leaders it's become clear that if the library/museum were to move to 521 Main Street we would be responsible for paying taxes, just like every other business. The current library is tax exempt under the Taxation (Rural Area) Act. Laws changed in the 1990s, and libraries are no longer able to own property. We were grandfathered in. If we move, however, a second party would have to own our building and we would make a lease arrangement. There is a solution to the tax issue, and we are looking at all of our options. Your ideas are more than welcome.

### What about grants? Why is it taking so long?

There are grants available to help us with expansion. We're learning that capital grants are not as common, and that it's difficult to obtain grants without a formal arrangement with the building owner. We had a contract, but it has lapsed. This spring we received special funding to hire a UBC library masters' student. During her 16 weeks with us, Stef researched and wrote a fundraising strategy for us, and found a number of grants available. We are working on ensuring that our plans are sound and sustainable before we continue with applications.

### Donations to date

We currently have about \$80,000 in the bank for library/museum expansion. Some of these funds are reserved for the purchase of 521 Main Street. If we do not buy that building, original funds will be offered back to the donors. This has all been raised through the generosity of our community members, past and present, as well as a number of local fundraisers like the apple pie days and harvest suppers. Thank you to everyone who has supported us to date!

### How is the library funded?

The bulk of funding for the McBride and Valemount libraries, and the Lena Schultz Reading Room in Dome Creek, comes from Regional District in the form of an annual grant. This is the result of a public referendum held within Area H in 1982. Like fire services and recreational facilities, libraries are a "joint or shared service" between the municipalities of McBride and Valemount and the rural Area H. This means that a portion of Village taxes go to the Regional District to manage these services.

Provincial funds, via the Ministry of Education, total about 10% of our budget. Other sources of revenue include donations, book sales, and smaller project-based grants.

### How is the museum funded?

The majority of museum funds come from the Regional District of Fraser Fort George, as per their Cultural Plan. The Museum is a member of the Golden Raven program which funds arts, culture and heritage organizations from Mackenzie to Valemount. Otherwise, the Museum relies on memberships, donations, and other small grants.



In response to the many questions we've heard on Facebook and throughout the community, we have compiled our most frequently asked questions. The answers below were written to the best of our knowledge and abilities (remember we're all human). Our goal is to clarify and move forward rather than divide. If you would like more details about our plans or progress, please come talk to us at the library. No matter how you vote on the 15<sup>th</sup>, we need to work together as a community.

### Why do you need a new building?

Our current library was built with a 1967 Centennial grant, volunteer labour and donations. In the mid-1980s, through a \$72,000 Expo '87 grant, volunteer labour, and donations, extensions were added on to each end of the building providing for museum space. The Annex was purchased in 2001, and provided much-needed programming, computer, and storage space. We now exist in a building that is almost 50 years old. Standards for public spaces, particularly libraries and museums, have changed in that time. The main building is in need of better insulation, new windows, a Heating Ventilation Air Conditioning system, and more space. The Annex lacks usable plumbing, and it needs improved insulation, windows, and more. The museum would like space for permanent exhibits, to better represent our local history and to attract tourists. Museum archives are currently spread between several buildings, increasing the difficulty to research and costs for storage. Library and museum services are changing in the digital age! Our space needs to reflect changing needs for technology, meeting, and community needs.

### Why can't you rebuild where you are?

We can rebuild where we are. This option is complicated by the fact that we are located on two lots, with two different owners, on four ageing foundations. A design was proposed by Regional District staff in 2007 that would allow for rebuilding in our current lot. This design, however, filled the lots and did not account for museum space. Conservative costs for rebuilding the library/museum in our current location have been estimated at \$200/square foot.

Engineers and builders have advised us not to add on to the current structures given their age (1960s) and state. The cost of upgrading both buildings to an acceptable state would be exorbitant, and would still not solve our space issues.

We believe that a new facility is the most cost-effective, long-term investment for our community.

### Why is the 521 Main Street option the best choice?

We believe that the purchase of 521 Main Street is far and above the most fiscally responsible option. While other buildings in town were looked at before we focused on 521 Main Street, the renovations required, the expense of the buildings themselves, the locations, or the limitations in size, deemed that these were not ideal options. The cost/square foot of 521 Main (\$65), even after renovations, is far cheaper than building a new one. Our vision is to replace the "for sale or lease" sign at the entrance to town with a vibrant cultural centre that draws tourists and residents alike.

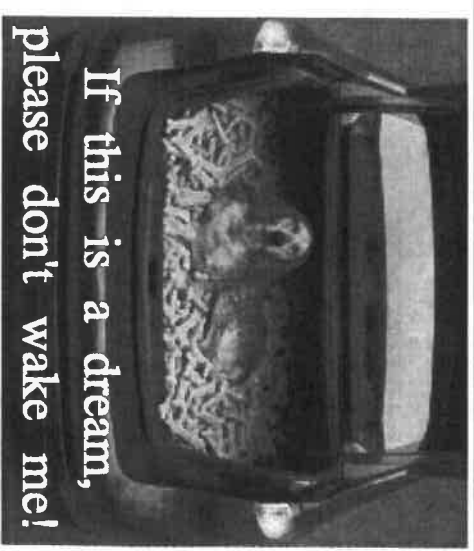
## A LITTLE THINKER...
