

Project Update - Library/Museum Expansion Copy of presentation made to Village Council by Joel Zahn, January 12th, 2016.

Thank you for your time this evening. As Chair of the Library Board and the Working Group on Library/Museum Expansion, as well as Treasurer of the Valley Museum & Archives, I am here this evening to provide an update on our expansion project and the upcoming referendum. When I last presented on November 10, I gave a brief overview of the history of the library/museum project, and the accomplishments of the Committee of the Whole. Through conversation with community members, and through our efforts with the Working Groups, we've established common ground: there seems to be consensus that both the library and museum have outgrown the current location. A great deal of focus and effort has been given to the question of what do about it. As a group, we tried to address every concern put before us. Our goal was to be a thorough as possible in assessing our needs and finding a location that would best suit our needs. In the end, the decision will be brought forward to the public this spring.

Updates: At its December meeting, the Regional District Board of Directors received the Robson Valley Exploration and Learning Centre Feasibility Study and gave the first three readings: to establishing a service and borrowing funds to purchase a new facility for the McBride & District Public Library and the Valley Museum and Archives.

The feasibility study can be viewed at the library, and it is in tonight's village council notes. It will be available on the library's website and the regional district's website.

Assent of the electors - or a referendum as it is historically understood - will take place on April 30, 2016. If supported by the electors, the Regional District will finalize the Offer to Purchase with the owners of the building and a long-term lease will be entered into with the McBride & District Public Library and the Valley Museum & Archives Society. The Library and Museum will take over operations of that facility.

Since the Regional District's December meeting we have had some feedback from the community: a mix of questions, concerns, and support.

1. What are the funding request amounts?

As outlined in the Feasibility Study, the proposed capital budget for the purchase of 521 Main Street is \$668,230. This includes basic renovations. When broken down according to assessment class, this would mean \$27.47/\$100,000 for residential and \$67.30/\$100,000 business. The majority of the costs would be covered by our utility suppliers and major industry. All amounts fundraised towards the project will help reduce the cost of financing, and will lessen the request to taxpayers. We are continuing to raise funds locally and to apply for grants. Directors of both boards are using their personal monies to buy lottery tickets.

Just today, we received a donation of \$15,000. We will apply this amount to the project and help lessen the amount we are asking from the referendum (assent of the electors). We are hosting a weekly community market at 521 Main Street and renting tables to local vendors. Those funds will go towards our project. Our goal is to reduce the \$27.47/\$100,000 for residential and \$67.30/\$100,000 for businesses as much as we can.

We continue to be open in exploring other avenues that may help us achieve the goal of a new facility through funding ventures.

2. Did you exhaust all possibilities?

The library and museum have explored a number of options over the last 20 years, including properties that have recently come to the market. We evaluated properties based on cost, accessibility, and practicality. Those evaluations were explored in a report that we have available to everyone at the library. We are happy to share the deciding factors with you there. The building at 521 Main St. stands out as the best choice due to a number of factors; the greatest being long term sustainability and fiscal responsibility.

3. We have heard that the timing is not ideal...

We're aware that our local economy is struggling. Every time a family leaves, we ALL feel it. We all care deeply about the future of our community. This project speaks to a number of possibilities for supporting local residents and helping to attract new families. There is no one answer to improving our local economy. We feel like this opportunity for a cultural centre at the entrance to town is one investment in our community's future.

4. How do I voice my support, my concerns, or ask my questions?

We are planning a number of community meetings in the valley for late March to best answer residents' questions and concerns. We encourage anyone, in the meantime, to drop by the library and talk to us. If there are questions that we don't have the answers to, we will get back to you as soon as possible.
