Eleanor has made immense contributions to the community through personal visits with seniors to organizing events through the Hospital Auxiliary and annual events such as the Terry Fox Run. Additionally, Eleanor participates in the Outreach Committee and youth group at the McBride Anglican United Church. A quiet helper, Eleanor has enriched the lives of many community members through her selfless service.

#### Pete Amyoony

Many people know Pete through "Pete's List" a weekly email fan-out which shares information about local events, connects people looking for rides, and sale items – but there is so much more! 
